The Embassy of India, Kathmandu invites applications from Nepalese nationals for admission in **MBBS/BDS** and **B.E./B.Tech./B.Arch./B.Pharmacy** in Indian Universities/Institutions under **Self-Financing Scheme** for the academic year 2026-27:

| <u>MBBS/BDS under Self Financing Scheme (SFS) 2026-27</u> | <u>BE/B.Tech/B.Arch/B.Pharmacy under Self Financing Scheme (SFS) 2026-27</u> |
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| <p>This Self-Financing Scheme is for pursuing MBBS/BDS course in India.</p> <p><u>Eligibility :</u></p> <p>(a) Applicants must have secured a minimum of 50% aggregate marks with at least 50% in Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology) separately and 50% in English in the qualifying examination [equivalent to 10+2 standard of CBSE in India – Equivalence Certificate from University Grant Commission (UGC), New Delhi and/or the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi must be enclosed].</p> <p>(b) NEET – It shall be necessary for an applicant to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in NEET – UG 2026.</p> | <p>This Self-Financing Scheme is for pursuing Bachelor of Engineering (BE/B.Tech/B.Arch) and Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharmacy) courses in India.</p> <p><u>Eligibility :</u></p> <p><u>BE/B.Tech & B.Arch:</u> (a) Applicants must have secured a minimum of 60% aggregate marks with at least 60% in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics separately and 50% in English in the qualifying examination [equivalent to 10+2 standard of CBSE in India – Equivalence Certificate from University Grant Commission (UGC), New Delhi and/or the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi must be enclosed].</p> <p>(b) Applicants applying for B.Arch. course are required to pass the Aptitude Test also as prescribed by the Council of Architecture. The candidates who do not pass the Aptitude Test will not be eligible for award of enrolment by Council of Architecture, New Delhi.</p> <p><u>B.Pharmacy :</u> Applicants must have secured a minimum of 60% aggregate marks with at least 60% in Physics, Chemistry, Biology (Botany & Zoology) separately and 50% in English in the qualifying examination [equivalent to 10+2 standard of CBSE in India – Equivalence Certificate from University Grant Commission (UGC), New Delhi and/or the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi must be enclosed].</p> |
| <p>The Last Date for submission of application for these schemes is 24 July, 2026 (Friday). Appearing Candidates may also apply pending final declaration of their qualifying examination results equivalent to class 10+2 standard of CBSE. Acceptance of applications of such students will, however, depend upon their being able to obtain required percentage of marks and submission of Class XII Mark-sheet.</p> | |

How to Apply :

1. Separate application forms should be submitted for each course. The applicants may download the application form from the website of Indian Embassy www.indembkathmandu.gov.in. The application form (in 4 sets) must be duly filled in (preferably typed) and the following documents (**4 Copies - notary attested**) are to be attached with the form:

- (a) Application form, duly filled in, with candidate's recent photograph pasted at prescribed place in all the four copies
- (b) First four pages of the passport.
- (c) Citizenship certificate with its translation in English;
- (d) Birth Certificate and its translation in English;
- (e) Character Certificate from the Head of Institution last attended;
- (f) Conversion of marks in percentage (%) from the Principal/Head of Institution last attended in a tabular format. *[If percentage (%) of marks not indicated, applications will be rejected]*
- (g) Certificates and Mark Sheets with percentage of marks of the qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 [A certificate from the University Grant Commission (UGC), New Delhi or/and Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi that the candidate's qualifying examination is equivalent to 10+2 standard of CBSE in India for the purpose of admission to MBBS/BDS/B.E./B.Tech/B.Pharmacy/B.Arch must be enclosed]
- (h) Valid NEET-UG 2026 Score Sheet (in case of applicants for MBBS/BDS Courses).
- (i) Valid Aptitude test score (in case of applicants for B.Architecture course)

How to submit applications:

The candidates who possess minimum qualifications and are willing to join these courses, should submit their application forms (complete in all respect along with supporting documents including NEET score card for MBBS/BDS and Aptitude Test for B.Arch.) at **Education Wing, Embassy of India, Kathmandu between 10.30 am to 12.30 pm from Monday to Friday on or before 24 July 2026 i.e. last date of submission of application form.**

Applicant should carry all original documents (mentioned above) at the time of submission of application form and he/she should be accompanied by either parent (father/mother) or guardian [duly authorized and declared as guardian by the parent(s)]. The parent/guardian must be carrying his/her Identity Proof (citizenship certificate/passport) and its copy to sign the mandatory 'Undertaking'.

Please Note :

1. All the four copies of the application form must be **ink-signed**. The recent passport size photo of the applicant must be pasted at the given space on all the four copies. **The application forms with photocopy of signature and/or photo will be rejected.**
2. The applicants are advised that merely forwarding their application should not be treated as assurance of their selection. Only those applications that are complete in all respects and applicants meeting the requisite eligibility criteria will be processed for consideration.
3. Shortlisted candidates are expected to comply with admission formalities, fee structures and procedures of the respective colleges/universities. These may include specific medical examinations including HIV/ AIDS test in India.
4. The list of colleges of respective courses are enclosed at **Annexures** along with **application form**. The seats are generally allocated in these Colleges/Institutes **but may vary depending on final allocation of the seats**. The applicants must give due care while giving preferences for the

Colleges/ Institutes as no request will be entertained with respect to change of College/ Institute once allotted.

5. **The seats under these schemes are on Self-Financing Basis and the Ministry/Embassy or Government of India does not provide any financial aid/scholarships/concession to Foreign students selected under these schemes.**

6. **Candidates are required to submit the proof of their financial capacity (bank statement etc.) along with the application form.**

7. Applicants are advised to familiarize themselves with the procedures and fee etc. for obtaining the Equivalence Certificate from UGC equivalence portal (<https://equivalence.ugc.ac.in/>) and/or AIU portal (<https://www.aiu.ac.in/evaluation.php>)

8. **Foreign applicants are required to appear in National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-UG 2026) conducted by NTA for admission in MBBS/BDS UG Courses in India.**

9. Foreign students having PIO, OCI card and NRIs are **not** eligible to apply for these Self Financing Schemes.

10. Applicants must ensure that **percentage of marks** mentioned in the application form are clearly indicated as such and not given in grades like A, B, C, D, E, etc. If grades are unavoidable, the marks obtained in percentages should be indicated invariably in brackets. **The application without mentioning the percentage of marks will be rejected.**

11. Marks obtained in 11th standard should not be mentioned/taken into consideration while computing marks obtained in 12th year of examination.
